

PREPARING TO SHELTER IN PLACE (What you should have on hand, if possible, and based on your budget):

Supply of Water (for drinking: 1 gallon per day per person; for use: fill bathtub and/or stage rain barrels.)

Generator and fuel (stove)	Propane Space Heater & canisters	Cooking Facilities (camp stove)
Blankets & Sleeping Bags	Important documents in safe place	Food (2-4 week supply)
Clothing (season appropriate)	First Aid & 30-day supply of Medicines	Radio (AM/FM/weather band)
Flashlights, Candles, Matches	Extra Batteries	Cash (both bills & coins)
Manual Can Opener	Toiletries & Bucket w/lid/seat/shovel	Personal Defense
Cell Phone Charger	Manual Charging Station (solar)	Tools*

RELOCATING (by vehicle):

Any of the above that fits into your vehicle (keep gas tank at least half full), plus: Extra Gasoline

Knife (sturdy, sharp, 3" blade)	Small Tool Kit (inc. a multi-tool)	Camp Axe & Shovel
Camp Chairs	Plug-in Cell Phone Charger	Car Battery Charger
Laptop/Tablet w/ downloaded survival information, maps, phone numbers, copies of Important documents		

RELOCATING (by foot – which basically means that there has been a major breakdown of society)

“Go Bag” for each person (a backpack that can carry 20-30lbs of gear – and consider your physical ability to carry all of this!!) This should go wherever you go as disaster could strike when you are on the road or at work).
